## REFERRAL/PRESIDENT REPORT

Happy New Year Brothers and Sisters,

I hope everyone had a great Holiday Season. The good times with family and friends is slowly coming to an end (except for those January and February Holiday Parties?)

We have seen some layoffs that were expected due to the weather. I do not expect this to be a long break. I feel like this is the calm before the storm.

I would personally like to thank every Local 158 Member for making 2019 a great year for OUR Local. We cannot thrive and grow as a UNION without all of your individual hard work. Thank you again and let's make 2020 even better! The book numbers are as follows: Book 1: 32; Book 2: 11; Apprentices: 0

In the past, the work picture for this time of year is usually stagnant. From the discussions with some General Contractors and our Employers, this may not happen this year. Green Bay Packaging (GBP) and the Point Beach Nuclear Plant (PBNP) Outage should start to man up in the months of January and February. How many electricians and the exact dates are pending as of this writing and are weather dependent. On the GBP site, the Boiler House project was completed by B&B Electric. PayneCrest is still working on the grounding and bonding package on the site, and Pieper is continuing to work on the Administration Building. A big thank you and kudos to everyone who worked/is working on these projects and making them a success.

The PBNP Outage will have calls out in late January, and early February. They are projecting their manpower needs to be about 31 JWs. The details of the scope of work will be out shortly once we have our pre-job brief with BHI.

We are all going to have some struggles on job sites throughout this year. There are problems everywhere: scheduling, engineering, manpower, pressure from customers, weather, a lot of hours, etc. I have been hearing them all and they are all true! **THIS IS WHY THEY HIRE THE IBEW (YOU/US)!!** I was talking with a retiree and I was rehashing those issues we have on jobsites. That was his comment back to me. I thought about that for a while and he was 100% right on. We do not always win every bid, every contract, every job, every project, but we sure seem to be on all the tough projects. They definitely hire us when they need something done right, on time, and on budget. BE PROUD of that. Every job is not going to be easy, is not going to have an easy schedule, or not have

budget restrictions. This is why they hired you. They know you will get it done and get it done RIGHT! I am proud of our members for coming through time and time again. We will have to do it again in 2020; embrace the challenge, you were trained for it.

Hello Brothers and Sisters,

I hope that all of you were able to have an enjoyable holiday season.

2020 is here and it looks to be a very busy year for our Local. Between the work for Green Bay Packaging and the Solar Project, everyone will have their hands full in this area.

Last month the state organizers and I assisted Local 159 in Madison with their blitz. We made approximately 150 stops both at individual houses and local electrical contractors. Most of the places we stopped were small shops, staying relatively busy. A benefit of these blitzes is that we were also able to clean up the list for Local 159, removing the places that weren't contracting, and those that closed or were retired.

The state organizers also had our meeting in Madison. We were joined for our meeting by the Regional Organizing Coordinator, Lynn Arwood. Lynn gave the "I'm in" presentation. The presentation teaches the importance of internal organizing. The practices were also referenced by the campaign that was just conducted successfully in Danville, Illinois. 

## PAC ARTICLE

Happy New Year Everyone!

The President has been impeached! He is only the third President to be impeached in our country's history. The Senate hearing for Removal from Office will be held after Congress comes back from Christmas break and the Senate has proven to be ready for a fair trial as per Speaker Pelosi's request.

The Local PAC met on December 17<sup>th</sup>. We discussed the new NAFTA, which AFL-CIO President Trumpka approved.

We also talked about Circuit Court Branch 1 Judge, Paul Malloy's ruling that 234,000 Wisconsinites be purged from voting rolls. The areas that will be most affected are Milwaukee, Madison, and large college campus areas. Governor Evers was elected by 30,000 votes. Every vote does matter!

Georgia is going through the same process as we speak, they stand to lose 300,000 voters!

It is expected that the ruling will be appealed, but Judge Malloy has disallowed the League of Women Voters, a nonpartisan group, from being part of the appeal process.

We discussed the latest on Foxconn. Director Alan Yeung said they traveled from North Carolina, Illinois, Michigan, Ohio and Kentucky, but have fallen short on finding enough workers for their factory.

Governor Evers has sent repeated letters to Yeung stating that the contract must be re-negotiated due to all the changes Foxconn made. Evers said if they don't re-negotiate, there will be no incentives given. Minority Leader of the Assembly, Representative Gordon Hintz suggested that maybe Foxconn is not willing to pay a decent wage.

Don reported on the WDC Chair. Don also said the DSPS Office is being more friendly to labor and that he had a productive teleconference with them.

Don also attended the Building Trades VIP Luncheon and the tree lighting for the Green Bay Botanical Garden of Lights, in which we sponsor the Caterpillar.

The PAC discussed the Grassely/Alexander bill. We urge people to call their representatives and oppose this bill which asks that unions with healthy pensions support pensions of unions with a not so healthy status.

Don attended a meeting with Minority leaders Gordon Hintz, Assembly and Jen Schilling, Senate, and also a meeting with Troy Streckenbach, Brown County Supervisor.

Jesse brought up the newly approved and sponsored by Tammy Baldwin, suicide prevention hotline bill.

The number will be "988". No word yet on the date of implementation.

Our next PAC meeting will be held on Tuesday, March 17<sup>th</sup>. Please plan to attend.

PBS reports that approximately 118,000 in Wisconsin will lose food stamps, (SNAP program) due to Trump's cuts. Six counties and several Reservations will be affected in Wisconsin.

The DNR says that there will be increased numbers of stocking Chinook Salmon, Coho Salmon, Steelhead and Brown Trout in Lake Michigan this coming year.

Also, in DNR news, it has been found that the arsenic levels at the bankrupt frac sand mine in the western part of the state are 7 times higher than the state cleanup standards. The DNR says it is reasonable to expect the ground water may be contaminated.

U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin introduced a new bill that would help firefighters, 1st responders and part time EMT workers apply for 2 key housing benefit programs.

According to our AFL-CIO district liaison, a Labor Night at Miller Park is in the works for the week of the DNC Convention.

Iowa Caucus will be January 28<sup>th</sup>. Several politicians, including Julian Castro and Cory Booker, are asking why Iowa is always first; why not mix it up with some other states that represent the population better, citing that Iowa does not represent the diversity of the nation?

According to the NY Times, there is an economic warning sign for Trump in the Midwest. Wisconsin has only created 1.6% more jobs since his presidency.

The 90<sup>th</sup> Assembly Representative, Staush Gruszynski has issued an apology and statement of counseling he is receiving, after an incident in October at a Madison bar. Minority Leader Gordon Hintz has asked for his resignation and has removed him from all committees he was on.

Our State Treasurer, Sarah Godlewski, gave birth last Friday, December 13<sup>th</sup>.

In the Manitowoc area, Mike Howe, District 1 Alderman, has resigned and County Supervisor Bob Ziegelbauer has rejected a proposal to put the partisan redistricting on the ballot.
